For the 2022-2023 school year, the total annual dues will be \$800 for full-time members (\$17 total increase from 2021-2022), \$444 for half-time members and \$274.75 for quarter-time members (Title Tutors and Paraprofessionals). Also added to this amount is \$40 for every member for our local dues, Dues will be divided into 22 pays beginning October 10, 2022 (except Title Tutors divided over 18 pays). If you have any affiliation membership, that will increase your amount. (Contact Wendi if you would like to know if you have an affiliate membership attached to your dues.)

Every member pays the local dues of \$40 divided over your 18 or 22 pays. You will see 2 union dues deductions-one local and the other for OEA. No dues are deducted in September.

AJH	Very high SPED caseload numbers. Many IS's maxed out per guidelines. 6th grade has 39 students with 2 IS teachers. Caseloads are maxed and being shared with other grade level I.S's. Service delivery for many students is not effective with high numbers and the schedule we follow.	
Steele	 SPED concerns-I.S.'s are not seeing their caseload students to provide required services. They are supposed to be working with students while in co-serve and providing SDI during that time. Teachers are frustrated with a model that is not meeting the needs of the students. We are basing SPED servicing to students on staffing and scheduling, not on student needs. New math curriculum has been difficult to implement. Materials were received after school started. Teachers and students are struggling and 	

- overwhelmed. They are following the curriculum of the program-but not getting into instructional methods.
- 3. WEP's- gifted services are not being provided according to true "gifted servicing of students"-as we do not have a gifted program. Teachers are feeling that they are writing fraudulent documents.
- 4. PSAT/SAT administration. Responsibilities not distributed equally.
- 5. Home Instruction-still not consistent with the organizing, planning and responsibility of classroom teacher vs. home instructor.
